**Date: 2021-10-26**  
**Topic: Moving from Pain to Victory**

**Jacque Tyre** [00:00:01] Good evening, it is nine o'clock and time for our triumphant prayer call for righteousness. And tonight ---I love these Tuesday nights when we get together and we discuss and we pray into pertinent issues that are facing us individually as families, as cities, states, nations and Holy Spirit really guides and directs us on a variety of topics. And it's always enriching. I always come away with far more than I contribute, and I feel like we are all being disciplined by the spirit of God as we join our hearts together to seek His face. And as most of you know, Clay is on a trip with his son out hunting. And of course, I'm sure he is hunting for revelation as much as he is for elk or Big Moose or whatever it is he's hunting for this time. But we miss him, and I'm honored and very humbled that he would trust me to lead this call tonight. And we've got a great group of panelist on and as most of you will have read in the email that came out earlier, our discussion today is to discover how we are to move from pain to victory and not waste the pain, sorrow and sufferings that we face, but allow them to produce perseverance, tenacity and steadfastness and faith for victory. Yesterday, when we were on the call, it was like the theme through every host touched on this at some level. And as I was praying over what theme and Clay wrote and said, What do you want to do tomorrow night? Have you picked a theme? And I said, I really feel like this is it based on what the Holy Spirit was birthing? So I'm going to open with just reading a passage of scripture out of James and pray for us. And then I'm calling on Regina Shank to come on and share what God has given her first. In James 1 verse 12... And I'm reading out of the Passion Translation. It says if your faith remains strong, even while surrounded by life's difficulties, you will continue to experience the untold blessings of God. True happiness comes as you pass the test with faith and receive the victorious crown of life promised to every lover of God. Father, I want to thank you for the privilege of walking with you and walking with your children across this nation. With your saints, with your apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, teachers, intercessors, faithful seekers of the most high God. And I thank you father, that in the midst of being surrounded by many difficulties personally and in a corporate nature, in this time and era that we're living in, that we can press into you and we cannot waste our sorrows, that you give us grace to not waste our sorrows, not waste the suffering, not waste the pain. But you use all of these things to work a work of righteousness in us that having done all, we will stand and stand and stand unshakable,

immovable, always abounding in the grace of the Lord. So, father, I ask tonight as we share that it would be anointed by Holy Spirit, that we you would give us words and things to share that will touch into the hearts of your people that will cause us all to move from pain to victory in an incredible way so that your glory is revealed throughout the land in Jesus name. Amen. Regina Shank, I know that God has put something on your heart for us today, and I'm excited to hear what you have.

**Regina Shank** [00:04:20] Yes. You know, the journey with the Lord is just amazing, and I love walking this life with the Lord, and he is our teacher. And you know, I love the scripture in Genesis 50:20. It's about Joseph and Joseph at the end of his life, he spoke this in this chapter; Genesis 50:20. He said, you intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. And I love Joseph's attitude about what he went through and everyone knows his story of being, you know, his brothers being jealous of him, being thrown in a pit. Sold to the median knights, going to Egypt and, you know, being accused again by Potifer's wife and then being thrown in prison for years. And you know those that he interpreted their dreams but they didn't remember him for quite some time. And I thought about that, you know, when I compare my life to Joseph's, which has nothing, no comparison, really, except I put myself in some of those scenarios where it didn't seem fair what had happened to me? It didn't seem fair what life was throwing my way. But in the midst of it, and I'm sure it's the same with Joseph and I have more about him in just a moment. But in the midst of it, seeking God in that brings you to a place of peace that is not dependent on circumstances. And getting to that place, I think, is a powerful growth in us that we don't live out of our environment, but we live out of the peace of God within us and here in Psalms 105 it talks about Joseph again and God's talking about him {inaudible} in this, verse 16. It says he called down famine on the land and destroyed all their supplies of food-- and listen to this-- And he sent a man before them, Joseph, sold as a slave. They bruised his feet with shackles. His neck was put in irons to what he foretold came to pass till the word of the Lord proved him true. And one version says that the word of the Lord tested him until it came to pass. And then at the moment, the right moment, the king said, and released him. The ruler of the people set him free. And so you go on with Joseph's story, but the end of his story is full of victory in that he was able to save his family. He was able to save Egypt because of the wisdom that God had given him. And I have not, as I've read about him in the Bible I have not seen any bitterness in that man. And I think about how circumstances that have not gone the way we want them to go can definitely cause bitterness of soul

within us if we don't deal with them correctly. And I've said to the Lord many times, I've said, "I think you're trying to kill me, Lord." And of course, we know about death to self, and that is what God is after. So that self doesn't live out of what self wants anymore. Self lives out of the Lord Jesus Christ and his purpose for our lives. And I feel like if we can interpret the circumstances of our lives in the understanding that God meant it for good and I'm not saying that, you know, everything that happens to us is good because it's not. I lost my brother when he was 19 years old in a car wreck. And you know, I really had to fight the bitterness in me and the misunderstanding: Why did this happen? And so many people, when there are detrimental things that happen, they blame God. Where were you? And a lot of people say God is in control. No God is in charge, but he's not in control. And I think if we understand that and realize we live in a fallen world, some things happen because people make decisions. And God is not one who's going to control people. He is not going to come in and say certain things to us. We have the results of our actions sometimes. And so, but in the midst of that, God is able to create within us a softened heart toward others who have gone through the same thing. And the Bible tells us with the comfort we've been comforted with, we can comfort other people. I don't know how many times I've been able to comfort people in situations because of how God comforted me in my life. And also, you begin to feel compassion for others because you have experienced much of what they've gone through. And God is after us to create in us a heart that loves, a heart that continues to believe and a heart that is full of the presence of God. And I think that's the journey we're on. But if we misinterpret our pain and we don't use it for gain of Christ-likeness, then we've missed the bullseye of that situation. And so, you know, when we talk to people who've gone through some really horrible things, you know, if they can realize that if a person hurt them. Forgiveness is key. If circumstances didn't go the way they wanted, worship God in the midst of it. And I think about Jesus going through the garden of Getsemene. And he said, if it's possible to take this cup from me. But nevertheless, your will not mine be done. And you know, I have a lot to say, Jacquie, I'll get in aq minute [laughing].

**Jacquie Tyre** [00:11:00] Oh, you're good!

**Regina Shank** [00:11:02] But you know, my husband just, you know, he went through lung cancer. We've walked through that now for two years at least, and he's going back next week for a cat scan to see where we are in that situation. And you know, as we walk that journey, God is so close. I mean, I don't like the circumstance, but I love the presence of

God because he says, "Ye though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil." And I have seen that again and again and again that no matter what myself or my family have walked through; the valley of the shadow of death, he is there. When my son was shot on the streets of Kansas City, he was not killed, but God rescued him. In fact, he claims, and I believe him, that two angels came and took him into a house and they got him to the hospital. And it missed, you know, a vein in his leg by a quarter of an inch, and it bounced off a belt buckle on his stomach Or he'd be dead today. God was there. Now, why didn't he stop it? I don't know. But I'm telling you, it changed my son's life, and he is married and has two children now. He was single at the time. And after that we went to Ireland together and God just began to do amazing things in his life. And so I don't know why that happened, but I do know what the enemy meant for evil God used it for good to change a person's heart. And so, I just--I'll quit right there. I could talk some more. But I do believe that God is in the midst of our troubles with us. We are never alone. No matter what we go through and I want to yield to the work of the potter when I go through those things and I love that. I love how God is with us in this life. We are never alone. He walks with us. So, that's what I want to share right now, Jacquie. But thanks for asking.

**Jacquie Tyre** [00:13:13] That's awesome. And I think it is important that we share some of our stories. I mean, we all need to be wise in what we share, but there's a vulnerability that I believe is needed because sometimes we look at people and we think, well, if they knew what I was going through. and the reality is, every person I have ever met has got a story and there's stuff that they have gone through. And if they haven't...pretty inevitable that we all will because we live in a fallen world and God doesn't cause these things but He allows them to strengthen us and to bring us into a fuller expression of of who He is in us through these times of difficulty. Thank you so much, Regina. Let's see, Betty Love. What have you got on your heart today?

**Betty Love** [00:14:12] Well, Jacquie, I would like to share-- I believe that perhaps there are people on the call tonight that what I'm going to share is going to resonate with them. I believe it'll be a tool and impartation for some that will give them hope, others that will strengthen them. Some of you on the call, especially the panelists, know this, but we have a son that is in heaven with the Lord. And in 2017, January 2017, on New Year's Day, he had an accidental overdose with opioids and which is so much an epidemic in our nation right now, and not just because he's my son or was my son, but just the fact of the matter, he was very bright. He excelled academically. He excelled in sports. He just--what he set

his hands to do as unto the Lord, he did well. He even did well in business and in his late teens, early 20s he'd had had an issue with alcohol and some drug use, and usually it was at a major relational break up in his life and on two different occasions, it took a toll and there were accidents, there was jail; not, you know, in and out and just seeing the hand of God deliver him time and time again. and deliverance, rehab, I mean, we did many things that families and parents do to try to intervene with their children and just had seen him really come through and turn around and married. And life was good, and he had an excellent job running point for his company in a multi-million dollar business. He was drug tested, so it was a check and balance there. And then in the fall of 2016, his marriage began to shake. His wife wanted a divorce and Thanksgiving of 2016 while he was waiting for his new home to be prepared He moved in with us shortly and stayed with us during Thanksgiving, and our concern was that it would be a trigger. And so really, as we began to see things shake, kind of took that posture all through the fall through the holidays of that year like David. I mean, I was wearing him in intercession. And, you know, for many I mean, you don't stop, you still function. You still go. You still do. But it's that place of abiding in the Lord. And as time progressed, you know, we thought we were going to come out of it. And the first few weeks at Christmas time, we realized that he was probably using drugs again and there were just signs and even confronted it. All that you do to try to intervene. And one of the things that the Lord told me this and we had seen over the years the intercession that had spared his life time and time again. And, you know, at 34 years old, the Lord said to me, this is different this time you cannot go down the hall to get him. And we had a very candid conversation with him that, you know, he was at a crossroads place in his life. Well, the long and the short of it is on January--As I said, January 1 of 2017, he died. And I think that's something, you know, especially if you are strong in intercession, strong in the Lord, You know, you don't think that that's going to happen. But let me back up to December 1st of 2016. And what I want to really leave with the listeners here tonight is the power of the word and the power of worship. And that we are not like those who grieve, who have no hope. And every year, probably since about 2010, our church, our apostolic center, we always encourage our people to seek the Lord for one word or phrase for the entire Gregorian year. What is the word of the Lord to you? That one word or that one phrase? Well, on December 1st of 2016, the Lord woke me up early one morning and he spoke to my heart. And usually I would get my word for the coming year at the end of December, but the Lord said very clearly, he said, I'm going to give you your word for 2017. And not only am I going to give you your word, I'm going to give you a word for your husband, your son and your daughter. And then for weeks and

weeks, probably even months, where I had just been carrying the weight of the intercession for our son, the Lord, when he gave me my word for 2017, He said, "your word is celebrate." And when the Lord spoke that to me, an impartation of joy filled me, that I had really had to hold on to just war, to consider it pure joy and not let the circumstances of what we were walking through overwhelm us. And so the Lord, the word was for me, celebrate, for my husband, phenomenal, for our daughter, beauty, and for our son rescued. And my heart and belief when I heard that word, "we'll, Lord, you're going to rescue him." But as time went on and the reality set in, I believe exactly what Regina shared. People have a choice. God is not going to make you. He will work things for the good. He will do everything to the inth degree. If you have someone that you are warring over, I would tell you--or praying for or praying through: dont let go of hope. Believe God for a life. Pray. Don't stop praying because prayers do work. I will just insert this. I cannot tell you the number of people that we have seen delivered from addiction before Kimball the 3rds passing and after his passing. we have seen the Lord do phenomenal things in this area. so I don't want anyone to be in fear and saying, Oh dear God. But for us in this season and it was a season, it was a hard season, as we began to press through and just having done all to stand, Kimble made a decision. I, you know, I've told somebody andt hey said the devil took him and then somebody said God took him. and i said, no, the devil didnt take him and God didn't take him. Kimball made a decision and he knew the truth, and he knew the word, and he made a conscious decision. And that decision cost his life. Well, what I want to fast forward to now is just, you know, it says he who sacrifices thanks offerings, honors me and prepares the way that I might show him the salvation of God. That word celebrate, staying in worship. Standing on the word of the Lord. On the evening that the police came to tell us that Campbell had passed away, when there was a knock on the door that night, I had known in my knower since two o'clock that afternoon, but around 10:00 p.m. that night, there was a knock on the door and I thought, Well, perhaps it's him. And this was the following day on January 2nd, and I was going to go and open the door and the Lord said, "No, you need to go and look out front". And so I went into one of our guest rooms on the front of our home, and I looked out and there were police. You know, there were two police cars and another car. And when I opened the door, it was one of our best friends. My husband best friend, our son's boss and then two policemen and I looked at our good friend and I said, How bad is it? And he just shook his head, and I said, Is he dead? And he said, yes. And at that moment, the word, the worship, the the prayers that I had prayed, the word that I had stood on, instead of falling apart, which I will tell you on the spot, I fell to my knees. I had no idea how I would respond

or how we would respond in that moment. But in the midst of probably the worst pain that any parent could feel out of my mouth came Mary Song. I didn't anticipate it. I didn't pre-meditate it. I just opened my mouth, and what came out is "my soul does magnify the Lord. Into your hands Lord, we commend his spirit. And, you know, Kimball was born again. There are so many stories and details around this that instead of bringing despair to people, I think it really would bring encouragement for times sake. I want to--I don't want to go into all, but what I will tell you is this; we saw the power of God come into our lives and into our family in such a way. Our daughter, my husband, the word that the Lord I had been praying since December 1st. Phenomenal. Father, I thank you that my husband is phenomenal. He is a phenomenal man of God. He is a phenomenal father. I saw that word manifest in him as he stood up and he supported our family and I saw the beauty of the Lord in such a fragile place rest upon our daughter. And while my heart and my hope was that Kimbell would-- the word meant that he was rescued. I really do see that in the hour, the Lord rescued Kimbell and he brought him home with him. And I believe this with all of my heart. We believe this as a family. Had there been a redemptive intervention down the road for our son we believe that he would still be here and it's not on God's part, but it's on the choices he made. And as we walked through that time, I will tell you, we saw the power of the Lord to sustain us. We saw the power of the word manifest in our lives. We saw even joy in the midst of pain. And you know, people, there is a season of grieving. There is no doubt about that. I mean, the Lord even gives {sound cut out} place in the word of God where Israel stopped and they grieved over the death of different ones. And so, you know, there are some people that said in that moment, Well, we've never seen anything like this. You know, maybe you're in denial. No, we weren't in denial. But I will tell you, I believe that just like David, as long as his son was alive, you know, when he had gotten in the relationship with Bathsheba, they had a son. His son became stricken ill, and it says he laid on the floor and his servants were so concerned about coming, you know, and telling him that, you know, the child was dead or letting him know that. But immediately, it says that David got up from the floor, washed his face, combed his hair, put on a fresh change of clothes, and then he went into the sanctuary and he worshiped and he came home and he asked for something to eat. And they sat it before him and he ate. But he had fasted and he had prayed the entire time. But his response to the death of his son was to wash his face, change his clothes and go to the sanctuary. And I haven't thought about it until tonight, but that's exactly what we did on Tuesday evening. We got the word on Wednesday night. We did not cancel services. We went in and we worshipped the Lord, and we thanked him for who he was. And we thanked him that Kimball was born again and

spirit filled, and that he had joined that cloud of witnesses. So, you know, as time went on, we even had people that would want to project grief onto us when that's not where we were. And again, did we grieve? Did we cry? Did we go through a process? Absolutely. But at the same time, we did not grieve like someone who has no hope. We knew exactly where Kimball was. We knew that he had entered into the heavenly realm. And, you know, and that it brought us peace. But it was the word that the Lord imparted to me, As a war word on December 1st, celebrate. And no words spoken by God is without power of fulfillment and what he spoke to me became a part of me, and throughout that year 2017, my word was celebrate. And so he who offers up sacrifices of Thanksgiving, honors me and prepares the way that I may show him the salvation of God. So in the midst of the greatest pain, we saw the salvation of the Lord and we saw redemptive work. And the last thing is, I will say this, a couple of years after that On a Wednesday evening, I had a one of our relatives, a nephew, who had--Now our son, And it's the same thing, but our son was functional. You didn't see the lose everything, on the street, and that type of lifestyle. But with our nephew, you saw that. I mean, it was it was bad. I mean, if you would have looked at the two lives, you would have thought that our nephew would have been dead years ago. We had two men that we knew about. Our nephew was at a place that if he did not get deliverance, He was not going to live much longer. We got word on that. Then a young man that we knew who had a business in Harrisburg was in jeopardy of losing everything if he did not get deliverance and agree to help through rehab, and the Lord and all of that. And so on a Wednesday night in the midst of worship in our Apostolic Center, when we entered into worship, the gift of faith filled the place and the faith-- that gift of faith rose up in me to know that God was going to deliver these two men. They didn't know each other. They lived in different cities and there was an impartation that went out on our livestream. But it went into the congregation and we didn't call any last names, but we called these young man by name. Both in their late thirties, we called them by name to deliverance and healing, and just release the word of the Lord. A week to the day they were both on the way to rehab. Since then, my nephew has been totally restored. He was a nurse. He has even had his license restored, which is unheard of. the other man was restored to his business. And I think, you know, for some people, even in relationship with us because we do have strong faith and we do see miracles and we do see healing. When they heard the news that our son had died, I think it struck fear in them that, you know, well, what about my child? But, where we were is this: God's word is not without power, there is a choice. There are places where God gives you that word and you see people brought back from the brink of death and restored to life and delivered and healed. And

God is well able to do that. And I have seen that more than the other case. And again, this was not something that our son walked into blind and he made a choice and it cost him his life. But, in the end I am confident, I am persuaded. I know who we have believed in and I'm persuaded he is able to keep that which we have committed. And my soul does magnify the Lord. Yay God.

**Jacque Tyre** [00:33:40] Amen. Thank you, Betty. Thank you for trusting all of us on this call with your story, with your testimony. And one of the things I want to say as we prepare for Pat to come on is one of the keys that Betty shared is when you're facing the darkest of times worship. Years ago, I'll just interject this real quickly. The Lord said to me one one day when we were on, we were just going somewhere as a family and the Lord just dropped down into my spirit: you're about to face something that is the most difficult thing you've ever faced. No matter what happens, worship me. And within a month, we entered into just an incredible season of very, very difficult times. And the Lord said, worship me. And so I would show up on Sunday morning while we were walking through this and worship, and I had people coming to me going, you should like just like not do that. Because I was in the choir worship team or something And people would say, "no, you just need to sit down." i said, uh, no, the Lord told me to worship all the way through this, and I'm worshipping all the way through it." And we came through and what it produced in me was a strength of faith and a strength of confidence, and did not allow the circumstances to take me out. And It kept me from going into the dark pit that the circumstances were trying to lure me into, which would have made everything all the more difficult, if not devastating, more devastating than it already was. So remember that no matter what you're going through, you're not worshipping the circumstance, you're worshipping the God who is above the circumstance, and he is always worthy of our worship. So Pat McManus there in Illinois, what's God got on your heart today?

**Pat McManus** [00:35:50] Thank you, Jacque, for the opportunity with everybody today, and you know, there's a lot when you sent the text message out yesterday about the subject of tonight and I thought of David and and all the things that he had to go through, especially at Zik Lag, when is his buddies and all the people that were with them were wanting to stone him and everything because of the fact they've lost everything. And really, it began to for me, I went to Caleb. In the in the Book of Joshua in Chapter 14, because I can relate to some of the things that the concept of his life. and the one thing that really kind of stood out to me was that he had a vision for destiny. He had a vision for

what God was wanting him to do, and he had to wait because of the the insecurity, the disappointment and everything else from those that were around him. Bishop Hammons prophesied to me many years back and said that there was going to be an issue where we would lose things, but you'd lose it the first time, but you would never experience the failure again on the second time. And I thought, you know, he's telling me this stuff and I'm looking at him and say, Bishop, that aint really nice. But we lost the building. We lost thousands of dollars in the building. And it was really just so disappointing that we had to walk away because of major issues that took place because of stuff with people. The disappointing experiences with people, all the stuff that went on and we lost everything, literally lost everything. And to turn around and come back in to have over --and I can start crying, but over the last seven years of restoring back everything and then some has just been blown away for me. and what God has done in our ministry; He's changed our name. He changed everything in our ministry to where all of a sudden when we're , like you just said, we'll sit and worship, not 20 minutes, not 40 minutes-- we'll spend an hour and a half to two hours in worship. I'd rather do that than actually teach a message because I know in the midst of his presence, the message comes. And through worship the heart is changed. So I got to thinking about this in Caleb, where he understood his destiny. He never let go of the vision because he focused on the promise and even in the midst of the despair, with everyone else around him, discouraging him, bringing disappointment to him, the livelihood of others that had truly affected his everything for their destiny or for their progress forward, he's still never lost hope. Not only did he stay the course, he empowered the generation behind him. And so when we lose sight of the promise is when we lose sight of our purpose. And then from that, we need to be able to stay focused on our destiny. So the promise is sure and the purposes of God leads us to where we're going is foundational, and the destiny gives us the ability to find what we need to have. And it says in the word in Joshua Chapter 12, it says I shall be able to drive. lets see, starting in versus it says, now therefore, give me this mountain of which the Lord spoke on that day. For you heard in that day how the Anakin were there and that the cities were great and fortified. And it may be that the Lord will be with me and I shall be able to drive them out, just as the Lord said. I think sometimes our circumstances get us caught up into losing the vision or the promise, it causes us to be in despair and frustration. We get angry, disappointed, all the stuff and the reality of it is if we'll stay the course of listening to and hearing the word of the Lord as we are this day and our prayer calls throughout the years that we've been praying in the foundational thing of our nation. But we can relate it as what Regina and and Betty just said personally, we can see the fulfillment of God's purpose and

God's plan begin to unlock for us if we will maintain our vision and our focus on what's--two things: number one, on the word of the Lord. And on the promise of God. And when we do that, we'll see the fulfillment of what God wants to do in our lives. if I could say anything and I will tell you this and I don't want to go too far. But the reality of it is this, we stayed the course. The building we have is a blessing in more ways than what people could ever have. We've remodeled a building that they were actually wanting to condemn. Today, it's worth almost almost \$800000 that God is literally blessed us with that you would not believe. And that the ministry and the opportunities to be able to see something transition in the midst of what we got going on here and where we're at is truly amazing. So I want to, if I can encourage anybody this way: don't listen to the naysayers. Don't listen to those that have unbelief. Don't listen to those who doubt the process. Don't listen to those who are always trying to get you to be persuaded based upon the rhetoric of man. when God give you a promise, he fulfills the purpose and you'll be able to walk into the destiny where God wants to see. So, I would really encourage everybody to be able to understand the significance of his word. The purpose of his hand and the power of his name. And you'll be able to fulfill that which needs to be done in your life. Thank you, Jacquie, for the opportunity.

**Jacquie Tyre** [00:41:47] Amen. beautifully said, Pat. God is a restorer of all things and a lot of times I believe we don't see that restoration because we faint and we lose heart. Scripture tells us over and over again to not faint and not to lose heart. But the Lord will strengthen us as we wait on him. And I believe we've all, everybody on this call. all The hosts, everybody listening in, we've all got these stories where we've been stretched absolutely as far and further than we ever thought that we could be. And yet, as we sought the Lord, as we pressed in and said, God, how do I walk through this? He gives the strength, but he also releases the strategies. As we prepare for Anne Tate to come on I'll just share a number of years ago in the ministry here we were in the midst of --had put a contract on a piece of property for la easing and repeatedly I had asked the realtor and the landlord, Are you sure you have the zoning to accommodate a church? And they kept saying Yes, yes, yes. And because you're doing the Lord's work, we'll do the build out for you. Everything was done, it was completed and we were just getting our occupancy permit. And we found out we could not get the occupancy permit because they were not properly zoned and they were unwilling to pursue that. And in long, very long story made short, the landlord ended up suing us for over four hundred thousand dollars. And when the paperwork came, I was sitting at home alone. My husband was out doing something

for the evening and I sat there looking at the paper, going now what? And clear as a bell. I heard the Lord say, Turn to first Samuel five. And I read first Samuel five. It's where David is facing the enemy. The Philistines in the valley of Rephaim. I said, Lord, he faced them there twice, which one am I facing? He said, You're facing the first one. Go up headstrong against them. Hire the best attorney you can get, and I'll give them to you by Pentecost. This was on Good Friday at Passover. We did exactly what the Lord said. It was not easy. It was very, very challenging. There were times I felt totally inadequate. It felt like I didn't have the strength, the know how, I didn't have anything that was needed to get through it. And yet I had the word of the Lord. I had the promise of God. And we just followed it through. And I was sitting at Glory of Zion at the Pentecost celebration, and I got a message from my lawyer. It's finished. you won. God is faithful to his promises, but it took perseverance and allowing the Lord to do some things in me and in us as a company of people. We went through repentance. We looked at everything like, What did? What did we miss? God showed us some things that we missed along the way that I've now-- we learned from, and it caused a strengthening and a wisdom to develop in us so that we could press on and we saw what the enemy intended for evil to be turned around for good, even as what Regina started with at the beginning. So just a testimony, don't let circumstances take you out. Anne Tate, there at Glory of Zion, part of that story even. What has God got on your heart today?

**Anne Tate** [00:45:47] Jacquie, I was listening to all the different aspects of this and one of the things that occurred me, I lost my son in 2011. And then a year and two months later, I lost my husband. He passed away too. And when Matthew died, the Lord had given me a word. And he had consistently given me words of prophecy over Matthew, and one night we were in charge of the Wednesday night {inaudible} was speaking on faith and it was so thick in that tabernacle and there couldn't have been more than 50 people there. the faith element was so thick that I heard the Lord say, I can perform every wordde I have ever spoken into Matthew". And I leaned up to tell Chuck and Chuck said, "I heard it, I heard it. Matthew going to walk in glory with the Lord!" and Linda {inaudible} came from the other end of the pew. She said, "there's a word over Matthew" and he said {inaudible} And so that word was six weeks before he died. So, when he died, I had been with him the day before at Thanksgiving, I had been. We had a great day. Had A lot of fun because was that day and so we came home and he went back to Little Rock. And we came back to Dallas. And I was texting him the next morning as we were coming back and he didn't answer me, which wasn't unusual because he was cooking. He said he was going to

barbeque {inaudible} he loved to cook outside. And so my daughter called because the police in his home found her phone number first. Cause they couldn't get into an Iphone. And, so the police called {inaudible} and she called and answered, Donny. And Donny's outside and was talking to her and he came back and he said, Honey, Kelly wants to talk to you. and I said, Okay. And I went out there and she said Mommy, he's gone. I said, do you mean the camping or... You know, I couldn't get my mind around it. And he said, no mother. He's dead. And I said, No! And then. I turned around and looked at Donny and the Lord meant (?) this for my good and for Matthew's good and that is how we're going to walk through this. And I called Chuck, and he said the same thing that I did, he said, Oh No! and I said, Chuck, the Lord meant this for my good and for Matthew's good. And I said, this is how I'm going to walk through it. And over the next days were real awful to go through because it was a holiday weekend, and it was Thanksgiving weekend. I couldn't get any information from the police. We didn't know where he was because he was in Little Rock and we were in Dallas. And, as we walked through that, the Lord reminded me of the word He had given me. And then he begin to flood my mind with pictures. Cause Matthew was a media person. He did film. And the Lord showed me that he went into this screening room in Heaven. And {inaudible} a page would turn and it would be displayed for him what happened? He watched creation unfold. Because it conveyed for him things that words could not say. And it was the way to display it for Matthew. But I so knew where Matthew was that I {inaudible} And then, when Don died, In some ways, it was easier because Don had completed his destiny and he knew he had. But even in that the Lord so took care of me. Don was to talk to Keith without me knowing it before he died. And he told Keith, "I have completed my destiny, but Anne has not And I want you to promise me that you will see that she complete her destiny". and they have. And I am thankful. and they stood with me and kept me moving. A week before the funeral, three or four days after Donnie died. I said Lord, I ask you to restore to me my momentum. I don't want the devil able to take anything that belongs to me during this time. I want you to restore to me my momentum, my strength, my drive, my prayer life, everything That I would be liable to lose during this. And in my mind I said, I am not going to be a widow like any widow you have ever seen. And I began to move by putting one foot in front of the other. And I am getting testimony after testimony of people that I've worked with that were on the phone or in different capacities. I got a text from young man whose in Africa. And his son {inaudible} he is African, he is part {inaudible} and on his a farm this week they discovered gems, {inaudible}, emeralds. In great plenty. Where he is {inaudible} corn for years. The man is raised {inaudible} And he lives in the United States, goes back and forth to Kenya, and he

planted trees. I mean, I'm getting testimony after testimony of things that happened that took years to accomplish. but If I had been impatient I would have missed seeing everything that the Lord is able to bring to fullness. And in my life, it is such a testimony of victory. Because you can't out give God. He looks on your heart and if you stay steady, not perfect, but steady. {inaudible} and move with him, there's not a circumstance that can come into your life that will not create victory. And He will give you eyes to see it if you ask him. So, Lord, right now, I am impart of those that are on this call that might not be quite as far along in their destiny {inaudible} but Lord I ask you to impart to them grace, faith and strength to stay the course, to see it all, to relish the good times and the bad times with you with everything you have to pour out on them and knowing you are always going to win and He always causes us to triumph. He always brings us to the dream. The only way we can miss it is to stop. So bless those that are on this call, and I thank you for them. Amen.

**Jacque Tyre** [00:56:17] Amen. thank you Anne. what a powerful and beautiful testimony of the faithfulness of God and the way he spoke to you through each and every step. As we close, I want to share a couple of scriptures for us and then a couple of thoughts just to kind of wrap us up. This has been incredible. First of all, out of Romans 5 and I'm reading the passage in verse 3 and starting about midway: even in times of trouble, we have a joyful confidence knowing that our pressures will develop in us patient endurance and patient endurance will refine our character and proven character leads us back to hope. And this hope is not a disappointing fantasy because we can now experience the endless love of God cascading into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who lives in us. And then back over to James, chapter one, beginning in verse two: my fellow believers, when it seems as though you are facing nothing but difficulties, see it as an invaluable opportunity to experience the greatest joy that you can for you know that when your faith is tested, it stirs up power within you to endure all things. And then as your endurance grows even stronger, it will release perfection into every part of your being until there is nothing missing and nothing lacking. That's what God is wanting to do with us as we walk through difficult circumstances. as Anne was sharing, even about the words she had over Matthew. And I feel like I can share this because Dr. Miller shared this actually in the memorial service for his beloved wife, Amy, last Saturday. But a week ago today I had sent Dr. Miller a vision that I had on my way into the office on Tuesday morning of a glory cloud hovering over Amy's hospital bed. I could see it as clear as I can see the kitchen sink that is in front of me right now. And I knew in that moment that the glory was hovering around her. And of

course, like everyone else, my hope was that that glory was going to press into her and cause life to spring forth. And Dr. Miller said that he was hopeful in the same way. But in the end, it was Amy had a choice, another intercessor had written him of something that the Lord had spoken to her of a choice that Amy had. And I know one word that I had heard from someone was that if the Lord's healing touched her, then she would rise up from the bed, but if his presence touched her, she would be in glory. And I believe in essence, that is what happened with her. And we don't, in this side of things, always understand that because like Anne, we hear those word, hope springs in us based on what we are desiring. And yet God sees things we don't see and understands things that we don't have the capability in that moment to understand. But he's faithful and he will walk us through that and knowing his goodness and his faithfulness is what we lean into. And the final thought I have for us tonight is that when we're going through the difficult times, it is for a strengthening of our soul, not the soul lish or fleshly nature of us, but the strengthening of our soul by Holy Spirit to not allow circumstances to shake our faith, undermine our attitudes, our actions our righteousness or derail us from pursuit of God's purposes, his destiny for us. God will use all things to work together for our good as we press in to him, as we seek his face, as we pour out our love on him, as we trust him. And I believe he is allowing different things in order to strengthen our resolve in spirit and soul to move forward with him and to not shrink back in the days of adversity. We need this strengthening in this time. One final thing out of the memorial for Amy Miller from Saturday is I heard a resolve out of Dr. Miller and out of the others there that this loss will not take them out of destiny, but it set a fresh fire within. Yes, there's grief, but there is a fresh fire. To fulfill everything that God has purposed in destined. And that's my prayer for all of us today. So father, I know that those on this call, both the host and the listeners, those that will listen in the replay or read the transcript later, Lord, there are things that press us. There are difficulties that we're faced. We have questions with no answers. We have circumstances. We don't know how to get through them. But God, you are faithful. You are just and you are true. So father, I pray for your people to know this sweet securing presence of almighty God to know the hovering of Holy Spirit, to know the stillness, the firmness, the clarity of your voice, the releasing of strategies, and when there are no strategies to simply know that if we stay in step with you and do the last thing that you told us to do, that we are in a place of victory because you never lose. You are never defeated. You are the forever victorious, God. And we are your people and we celebrate you this night. And father, where those that are on the call are struggling with grief and walking through deep, dark valleys. God, I pray for each and every one to be comforted with the

comfort that comes through Holy Spirit, that they will be strengthened from their innermost being, that they would be surrounded with your love and that you father God in your mercy would send faith filled people to come along side to just be with your strength by their side. Father, we surround them now with your love, with your goodness and with your kindness. And we say, God, we welcome the strengthening that you bring to us by the power of Holy Spirit that we would be a people in this day and hour, that having done everything in pursuit of you that nothing would shake us, nothing would cause us to shrink back, but that we would be filled with firm calm assurance to press on toward the mark of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus that your name would be praised, your kingdom advanced and your glory revealed for all the world to see and know that Jesus Christ is Lord of all and we bless you, father, we thank you and I bless these your people in Jesus name. I thank you all for being a part of this call tonight. We pray that you were blessed, that God ministered to you, and that you will continue to go from glory to glory as you set your face to behold the king of glory and he will change you. He will do a work that is beyond anything that you could ever think or imagine. We will be back with you tomorrow at 2:22. This call will be posted.
