Tuesday Night Call

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Topic: My Comfort Confirms Your Prophetic Word released 6/12/21 by Clay Nash

Clay Nash [00:00:17] Well, greetings. It's Tuesday night, it's 9:00 p.m. on the East Coast, and we're here for our call tonight. And I appreciate everyone that signing in, getting on. I appreciate our host. I'm excited that the Republicans stood up today strong and they stopped that ballot. The SR1, I think it was called, The People Vote Ballot, whatever it was called, the nonsense. And I just rejoice in that. They might have claimed they took the Senate, but I believe they are learning they did not. Well, tonight, we've announced that we're going to be diving into a prophetic word that came forth on June 12th, I guess it was. And I'm going to read it to you at the beginning. I'm going to pray over us. I'm going to bring out a couple of points and then I'm going to begin the call. In fact, Regina Shank, I'm going to call on you first so you can be getting prepared and I'll get the list lined up. I see the hosts that are getting on. But the prophetic word goes like this:

The Lord says, I had to take you out of your comfort zone in order to bring you into My comfort." "But, let it be known that My comfort does not comfort in the way your comfort zone does. My comfort conforms you...to My image.

"The conforming to My image (brought about by My process of comfort), will bring you out of 'the old,' in order to take you into 'the new' (your inheritance). I am bringing you out of the barren wilderness...but now you must allow My Spirit to remove the wilderness mindset that has become ingrained in you during the recent journey.

"For the days ahead are days of living sacrifices - yielding, remaining still - upon my altar. I am a consuming fire that must consume all that is not Me. But the days that lie ahead will prove that your surrender to Me is your strength. This surrender, resulting in a newfound strength, will be triggered by your hunger for My presence, a presence that leads you, not only from strength to strength, but from faith to faith and victory to victory.

"Your surrender will cause our oneness to become a bond of love, and you will see the promises you have battled FOR become the promises you will battle FROM. In this new place I have prepared for My body, you will discover the words that set the enemy to flight will be, "It is Finished."

Father, we thank you for tonight's call. We thank you for every person that's on. Those that will be joining and even those that will listen at a later time to the recording. Father, we thank you for the hosts that have made time out of very busy schedules to be on this call tonight. Father, let us model and bring forth not only a revelation, but spiritual

understanding from this prophetic utterance and word that was released there in Clarksville, Tennessee. Help us to know. Paul instructed us in your word, Lord, that according to prophecies, we were to war a good warfare. Give us a strategy so that we can war well from this word. We thank you, Father, There's a refreshing that is flowing over the Ekklesia. The praying church. And That refreshing is going to cause us to step in and engage in a new level. Father, there are so many, I'm getting emails, hearing from those that have become weary in well doing. I pray, Father, that they find spiritual understanding tonight from this word about surrendering and it becoming a strength. So, Father, as we dive into this word tonight give us your revelation. Give us your spiritual understanding that we might war a good warfare as we see this nation turn. As we see the harvest come in. as we see awakening take place and as we see transformation take place. Do these things now in Yeshua's name, Amen. Before Regina comes on I just want to go back to that part where the Lord said my comfort conforms you to my image. You know, I've walked with the Lord for forty years now. And I must say we've walked through some great times, exciting times, blessed times, but we've walked through some challenging times. And I've watched even in those challenging times, a scripture that always come up. I remember at the loss of our son in law, Dutch just happened to be in town preaching for us and on that Sunday morning, he preached the message of hope. But one of the things that he brought out, and it was something I knew, but I heard it fresh that day and it was the scripture it says, all things work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to Christ purpose. Not all things are good, but all things can work together. And that's one of the ways that God conforms us. You know, when these moments like that come in a great loss, you can either allow that loss to be beneficial in conforming you in a greater capacity and greater away into the image of God, or sadly, as some do, walk away or withdraw or back up in that. And so the comfort of the Lord is something strong, but it's also something that is conforming. And, you know, I sometimes tell people I'm a little bit humorous, but it's very true. If you really got...when you see me, if you got real spiritual eyes you can see the tattoo I have on my forehead and it says under construction. And you know the truth is, he's working on all of us and that conforming to his image. The last thing I want to say is this, Watchmen Nee in one of his books I read a hundred years ago. He said this. He said, "The problem with a living sacrifice is that it keeps trying to crawl off the altar. And in the midst of all the bad, the chaos, the word that Jane Hamon released at the beginning of the year, that this would be a year of conflict. I remember when she prophesied that I thought, "well, what was last year?" But it would be a year of contending. And I heard Holy Spirit say only those that contend with the conflict from the victory of covenant will prevail. And so that's where we are tonight. Regina, I'm asking you to open it up. Those are just a few of my thoughts. I'll bring some more out as our other hosts do. But what's in your heart tonight?

Regina Shank [00:08:05] You know Clay, this has been such a wonderful word. I've been unpacking it. There's so much in it. And several things that came to me--I thought about our wilderness mindset that it talks about and we don't know we have a wilderness mindset until God reveals that to us because we believe lies sometimes and we don't even realize that their lies and we're living out of those perspectives. And I think the prayer for me is, Lord, show me where I am living in a wilderness mindset. And we know, some scholars say that the 40 year journey that the Israelites wandered in the wilderness could

have just taken 11 days. And when you look at that and you realize they wandered in the wilderness for 40 years because of that wilderness mindset. And what I've seen in the word, and I'm sure you have two, is that God has to take us out of the place of the familiar in order to bring us into revelation, because the power of the familiar keeps us in a place that God doesn't want us to stay in. And I was looking here in Matthew 4, it's very familiar. It's the calling of the first disciples, but it says this: Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee. He saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake for they were fishermen. Come follow me, Jesus said, and I will make you fishers of men. At once they left their nets and followed him. I think that is a decision that they made that brought them out of the familiar. And they could have said, no, this is my comfort zone. This is where I want to stay. This is what I've always done. It's what I know. But they did not. And they immediately left their nets and followed him. And he also, another brother is there, James and his brother John, the same thing happened. They were called and they immediately left the familiar. They left their boat and followed Jesus. And you see this whole pattern in scripture. You know, we're where David was taken from the sheepfold and, you know, into a place that's unfamiliar. You see Joseph taken from his family. And so God takes us out of our comfort zone in order for us to depend on him. And I've seen that in my own life as well. And I know his comfort. God's comfort is uncomfortable to our flesh because it's unfamiliar. It's not places that we've been before. And surrendering to the Lord in that place is where our promises come from. And it is hard to stay on the altar. I agree with that quote by watchman nee. And you know, that altar is that place of complete surrender, trusting God. And that means we have to take our hands off of it. And I think about how many times in my past I've tried to help God out. And I I've told him, you know, this is a good idea. Why don't you bless this? But it wasn't from his spirit. It was my good idea. And I'll never forget, years ago, the Lord interrupted me. I was telling him what I thought he ought to do. And he said, when are you going to quit building a stage for me to perform on? He said, Regina, I want you to do what I ask you to do instead of you telling me what to do. And my life changed at that time. I thought I was helping God out and I was in his way. I was touching what I should not touch. And I had a wilderness mindset and I was telling God how to do it. And that's what the the children of Israel did in the wilderness. You know, they complained. They grumbled. They wanted this. They wanted that. And they wanted it now. And if we can come to that place of trusting the Lord, then we do reach those promises that God has for us. And I love Exodus 33 where Moses said to to the Lord, if your presence doesn't go with this, don't take us from here. And I think the presence of God is so important to be led by him. And we know in the wilderness they were led by the cloud and they were led by the fire, but they never entered in. And so my prayer tonight is that we will leave our comfort zone and we will step into the comfort that God has for us, which, like I said before, is uncomfortable to our flesh and that surrender to the Lord is...It's a place where we die. I mean, we die to what we think our future could be or should be. We die to what our hopes and our dreams are. He gives them to us, but then we die to our ability to bring them forth and we trust him explicitly to do what he said he will do. And as we do that and we don't touch anything, that he is telling us is going to happen. And I'm walking through some of that right now. I'm walking through some promises that the Lord has made me. But if I touch them, I'm going to destroy them. And it's kind of like the story of the ark where Uza was going to help the ark get to where it needed to go. If I touch my promise and try to

make it happen, then I have touched the ark in a sense, and I have to keep my hands off, trust the Lord, come into that uncomfortable place for my flesh of waiting on the Lord for him to bring forth what he wants to bring forth. And I'm always reminded of Joseph. It says, you know, until the word of the Lord came to pass, it tested him. And all of us have those places where we have a word of the Lord and it's testing us because it hasn't come forth yet. And our temptation is to help God out. Our temptation is to say in our comfort zone, which is to control the situation. But it takes huge trust to say, Lord, I'm not touching it. I'm waiting on you. Your timing is perfect. Even it seems like a long time to me. But his timing is perfect and he will bring it to pass and he will cause our comfort zone of the familiar to be traded in for the comfort zone of being in his will and walking with him into a new place and the fulfillment of what he has for us. So those are the thoughts that I had about your word. I think there's so much more in there. I probably just, you know, touched the surface of what's in the depths of that word, Clay. But that's what I had. And I believe trusting God is the key to get from here to there and not allowing our flesh to enter in and help him out.

Clay Nash [00:15:33] Yeah, that's good, Regina. You know, even Jesus, in his moment of great challenge, he said to the father, let this cup pass. But then he surrendered and he said, "no, not my will, but your will be done". I kept hearing that as you were speaking there, Regina. That's where our strength comes, is when we surrender in obedience to the will of God. Dan, you're on with us. What's in your heart tonight?

Dan [00:16:08] Hey, thank you, brother Clay, I appreciate being on with everyone tonight. And as I was meditating on your word about his comfort conforming us immediately, I know this seems like it's kind of interesting, but the Lord highlighted today 1st Samuel 17:37 when David said, the Lord who delivered me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear. He will deliver me from the hands of the Philistines. And one of the ways that the Comforter brings comfort to conform us into the image of Jesus is when we find ourselves under pressure. A lot of times he'll be the one to prompt us of victories, of testimonies of victories that we've had in the past that were for the purpose of revealing God's character and nature and His faithfulness. And one of the things the Lord spoke to me is He said, after I do something multiple times for you, he said, that testimony becomes your history. And the history you have with me now puts a demand on you responding in faith when you face a new challenge. And many times that surrendering is honoring God by in the midst of that current pressure, acknowledging with our mouth what he's already done. So one of the things that was producing courage in David as he faced something that was causing fear in a whole nation, was he had to remind himself that the Lord had delivered him from the paw of the lion. Delivered him from the bear and he will deliver me from the hands of the Philistines. So in this current situation, with what we're looking at with our nation and the prayer calls and everything, it's very important that we remember all of the prophetic words that have already been answered, all of the things God already did, and the miracles that he worked from 2016 up until this point, and the reality of that he will deliver us from what we're looking at today. So that comfort conforming us is many times the Holy Spirit, bringing up past testimonies that have revealed God's true nature, an experience with God that now caused scripture to become an experiential thing, not just the head knowledge or theological thing to the point where now we have, as Christ did, to trust the will of God on a whole 'nother level, because we know who he is. We know

his nature, we know his character and the reality that he is faithful to fulfill his word. And one of the things you said that was so significant is you said "it is finished" in your dream. And I thought that was so significant because ultimately this war has already been won. We're just fighting battles, walking together, fighting battles, needing the Comforter to be with us so that we can enforce the victory of the kingdom advancing in the earth that's part of the war that's already been won. So for me, when I heard you say that comfort informs us, for me personally, it is not losing the testimony allowing the Holy Spirit to remind me of the testimonies when I'm under current pressure of the victory, many times in the same area that I'm experiencing pressure under in the current situation, we've faced many of what we're facing as a nation and we have watched, Clay, you've had prophetic words answered. Dutch has had prophetic words that we have watched be fulfilled. And I'm just saying I feel like that the Lord is saying one of the ways he does that is we have to remember he's delivered us from the paw of the lion, he's delivered us from the paw of the bear. And whatever it is we're facing, he will deliver us from the hand of this philistine. So I would just encourage everybody to understand that that's been one of the most significant ways he's brought comfort to me is in the midst of the pressure. When everything seems so confusing, the Holy Spirit will remind me of testimonies. I'll find myself telling people who are going through difficult circumstances of ways that God had come through for me. And all the sudden it's like I'll have forgot that that had even happened until the Holy Spirit brought it up. And it brings peace and confidence and the capacity to trust and have faith because why? I'm getting back in touch through the comforter with the nature of who my heavenly father is.

Clay Nash [00:20:45] Amen. Amen. Strong man, very, very strong. Brother, Jim Hodges, always good to have you on with us, especially from the great state of Texas. What what can you contribute tonight?

Jim Hodges [00:21:04] Clay...and team. Cause I'm always encouraged by what the Lords giving to the team. And let me say tonight, this is one of those words in my understanding that has layers of revelation. And so I'm...I'll say I'm just kind of still processing. I was grabbed by several phrases in it. The whole thing, of course, was excellent. But the one strong phrase for me was "your surrender is your strength". And I thought about--I forgot who said this, I would quote them if I could remember because but you're not supposed to plagiarize, right? But I can't remember who said this, maybe on the previous call, that goes along with that statement of your surrender is your strength in the idea of yeildedness is more powerful than commitment. And I thought about that, because, you know, as leaders, how much time that we spend trying to get people to commit, hello, to the vision, to God's purpose and the word that's being released. But let me just say a few things about before we learn scripture. I love these Tuesday nights by the way, I always learn very much and I appreciate all of you. The word comfort is obviously the same word that's related to our comforter. Obviously, the Holy Spirit, who is our guide, who is our advocate and probably the most important word, and its the Greek word means our parakletos: you know, literally called alongside the help and all that that would mean. And it's interesting, in a rather lengthy passage, I'll say lengthy, at least five or six verses in Second Corinthians 1 which I'll read momentarily. The word there for comfort is paraklesis and so you can hear and by the way, it's translated not just comfort, but encouragement.

And so there is the para, the alongside, the help. we know he's in us. But when we know, he's just alongside to help us in all we need helping in and we do need help. How many times did David, pray: Lord help. And I'll paraphrase: Lord, Help me right now. Don't delay. So the scripture, of course, is in Corinthians 1 and well Paul just starts like he does in most letters, "grace to you and peace from God our father the Lord Jesus Christ . Blessed be the God and Father of Lord Jesus Christ, the father of Mercies and the God of all Comfort- - and that word there is basically in the individual text, encouragement-- who comforts us in all our afflictions so that we will be able to comfort those who are in affliction with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. That's pretty powerful. You know, Paul said, OK, as the Lord has comforted me, he can use me, Of course he can use others in leadership, in the body of Christ to comfort others. But just as the sufferings of Christ are ours of abundance, so also is our comfort abundant through Christ. That's pretty powerful right there as the battle rages come on in our nation, there is destiny, prophetic purpose to unfold. Hello? We know as the battle rages we will need even more encouragement. Then Paul goes on, quickly, "for if we are afflicted It is for your comfort or encouragement and salvation, or if we are comforted, it is for your comfort which is effective with the patient enduring of the same suffering with which we also suffer" Then he says lastly here "and our hope for you is firmly grounded, knowing that as you are sharers of our sufferings, so also you are sharers of our comfort and our encouragement. And I'll just close with this comment. I believe the word that Clay released is designed by the Lord to really make us, Ekklesia team and for all those who would flow with that revelation of Ekklesia, to make us more cohesive. to be able to stand ever more strongly with one another. To me, this is...I'm really aware more and more of how the encouragement from you is needed in my life. And when I watch, of course, Glve Him 15 every day, that brings a lot of encouragement as well as insight, information, education and prophetic revelation. So I'm excited and I just think there's layers to this Clay and team and the more layers we see, the deeper we can go to get into the heart of the spiritual father, like Paul and to right this church that, you know, sadly, as we all know, at least for too long a while only saw Paul is a teacher like a polisher Peter, that really dismissed him as a spiritual father, even though he indeed was their father. So I would just say, let's keep digging and let the encouragement and increase, let the work of parakletos build another level in us and through us in Jesus name.

Clay Nash [00:26:49] Amen. Thank you, Brother James. Always appreciate what you bring. Jacquie, I want you to go in just a minute, but I want to step in for just a minute, you know, when this word came forth just over a week ago. Over the years, I've given a lot of prophetic words, but this word saturated me, I don't have a word to tell you. It has gripped me as strong as any word that I've heard or even prophesied and as brother Jim said, there are layers upon layers, but in praying into this word, I want to bring this out. The phrase that said, "and you will see the promises you've battled for become the promises you battle from". And I've been asking the Lord about that. And I spent this afternoon in some very serious preparation and prayer over several things. The word that Dutch brought forth or Tim Sheets on yesterday. Just it really grabbed me as well because it's something I was carrying. But here's what I heard Holy Spirit say to me. It ties into a teaching, but when the word of God tells us that when God speaks, faith comes to us. But what I've discovered from God's word and experience, there's still the journey to come to

faith. When God speaks, I begin to believe what he said. I begin to believe his promise. But once I make the journey to coming to faith, I become one with that truth. And once you become one, once you know the truth and you become intimate with it, you become one with it. It's a totally different situation. So what I am concluding and subject to change, but what I am coming to conclude off of what the Holy Spirit said to me today is that when we have heard God speak his promise and we're in that journey of believing but have not yet made the journey to come to faith, we battle for that promise. But once we come to fight, then we battle from his promise. Jonathan went out in the wilderness, Son of Saul, prophesied to David, "you're going to be the next king. I'm going to stand at your right hand". We know the cultural authority of that. That time in the land was he was Saul's rightful heir, but he prophesied different to that because he had heard from God, he had heard a promise and he believed the promise. But the scripture says he turned then and went back to his father's house. And we understand the reality. It's always very easy when you're battling for promise to turn back to that which is familiar. And he did so. And as a result of him turning back, he died on the wrong day for the wrong cause, on the wrong sword. And we he never did fulfill the promise because he never did become one with the promise of standing at David's right hand. So I wanted to put that out because that phrase has really caught me. You know, I think it even ties into we pray to know the will of God from our priestly anointing, but then we decree the will of God from heaven back in the earth, from our kingly authority. And so I put that out for measure. some of the host, even if some that have spoke want to come back in on that it would be great. Jacquie Tyre, What's in your heart?

Jacquie Tyre [00:30:51] Oh Clay, I love this word and I feel like I've been walking this word for a long season. And you by Holy Spirit gave articulation to it. And I'm going to start with where you were just speaking into, because I had just written on my piece of paper where I had printed off your word, and it was about that phrase battle for the promises you will battle from. I read in the margins, you battle with confidence in promises, although they are already fully manifested. And that's to battle from. When we become comforted with the comfort of the Lord, when we're transformed, conformed into that, we do become one with that promise. And it doesn't matter what the circumstances around us look like. We know that we know that we know God said, therefore, it is done, even though we may not see it. And I believe that's a part of what this word is about is getting us conformed. And I want to take just a minute and read Romans 12: 1-2, because every time I read your word, the word God gave you, I am reminded of this passage and I'm going to read it out of the passion translation. It Says, "Beloved friends, what should be our proper response to God's marvelous mercies? I encourage you to surrender yourselves to God, to be his sacred living sacrifices and live in holiness, experiencing all that delights his heart. For this becomes your genuine expression of worship..." I love that. "This becomes your genuine expression of worship. Stop imitating the ideals and opinions of the culture around you". The sub note on this says, "Don't be squeezed into the mold of this present age. But be inwardly transformed by the Holy Spirit through a total reformation of how you think this will empower you to discern God's will as you live a beautiful life, satisfying and perfect in his eyes". And I believe that is what this word is pressing us to. There is a place when our comfort zones or the comfort, if you will, that the world will give us, will justify how we live, will justify how we think, will give excuses for why things aren't happening, will even in

extreme cases, pet our flaws, pet our demons, if you will, those things that keep us from that union with Christ but God's comfort coming alongside us lovingly presses us into a union with him, that our greatest delight is being conformed into his image of dying to flesh, of not wrestling against getting up off of the altar, because we're all prone to move off in trying to protect ourselves. But when we allow the comfort of the Lord to conform us and bring us into that, giving up of our own rights, our own opinions, our own ideas, our own...the way we want it to work and coming into this union with Christ. And for weeks now, I've had Holy Spirit saying to me, I want you to walk in such oneness with me that you are simply walking in my steps. And I don't even know how to articulate what he shows me, the fullness of that. But such a union that he's wanting to conform us individually, but he's wanting to conform His Ekklesia into, that we are so in him and he in us that we know that beyond just the words of his promises are yes and amen, we're so one with those words in the conformity, the transforming from the inside out of us into him, that we pray with confidence, that firm assurance that it is finished, we pray it as though it is already manifested because in the spirit realm, it is. And the final thing I want to say in this is there was a phrase in the next to the last paragraph, but the days that lie ahead will prove that your surrender to me is your strength. That word prove just jumped off the page at me. And so I went and I looked up the definition to prove something, to establish the existence, to establish truth or validity, to demonstrate is having a particular quality or worth, to show oneself to be worthy or capable, to test the truth, to test the validity or the genuineness of, to test the worth or quality of and to check the correctness of something, to learn or find out by experience. I love that one: to learn or find out by experience. When we walk through this process of allowing our comfort zones to be broken away, taken off, and we forsake our comfort zones to come into union with the comfort of the Lord, the encouragement, the comforter, when Brother Jim was talking about that word, encouragement, that is to be bestowed with courage, that we come in to not our courage, but the courage of Holy Spirit, that what we proclaim with our mouths becomes such a saturation with us of substantiation, of validation that what our words are, it is the very reality of our life, and I believe that is what God is doing with us individually and as the ekklesia. And as we come into that, when we move from the priestly prayers into the kingly prayers, there's such an authority that comes because of the validation, the proving of our oneness with him, the proving of our living in his comfort, not simply in our comfort zones, that the it is finished will carry such a weight in the spirit realm that will begin to see things move at an accelerated pace. And I'm just saying, God help us let go of everything in our flesh, in our own carnal nature that would pull us into self comfort and those things that make us just feel placated in the condition we are and that we would press into your comfort and allow you to do all that you need to do in us so that you might do all that you desire to do through us to see your kingdom established on Earth even as it is in heaven, in Jesus name. Amen.

Clay Nash [00:39:11] Amen, thank you, Jacquie, for that. You know, I believe that you and the host that are on tonight, I believe we're releasing not just revelation, but spiritual understanding out of a prophetic word that's going to help us all. I know I'm hearing things that are not just encouraging me, but instructing me. It's helping us all go to another level and warring from the promises and warring a good warfare. Pat, you're on with us. What's in your heart?

Pat McManus [00:39:47] Thank you Clay for the opportunity to be with you guys. This has been powerful. All the words that have been shared so far has been very much so revelatory in my heart, that's for sure. I have a couple of things and Jacquie mentioned one of them. But the comfort, the part of the comfort thing and I look at it this way to give you a picture, remember when Jesus called Peter out of the boat, he called him out from a place of his comfort into a whole different dimension of where Jesus was walking in his comfort. My question was always been, how come the disciples that didn't walk out with Peter when he began to walk on the water, They stayed in the boat, but he walked. And so there comes a point where I think the transitional part we have to learn to trust in the word that God is saying, the comfort that being released from the word that's being placed in our heart brings us to a place of being able to step out into something we've never moved in to be able to fully fulfill the purpose of how God wants to do something through us. So as we step into that, we begin to start walking, as it says in the word, your inheritance, a new understanding of kingdom authority, the kingdom foundational ability because of that coming into that oneness or the image of Christ, we come into the place of the comforting words that he speaks to truly walk in the inheritance that God says is ours to walk in. And the part that, as Jacquie just said, the same thing. But the days ahead will prove, in other words, by the yielded heart to the surrender, are consistently yielding to the word that is being spoken, not coming from not doing our own will or not doing what we feel we need to do. But we're relying upon trusting in and being able to walk fully in what God is wanting to see done as we move according to his purpose. And over the last couple of days I've been reading this. These two psalms have come so strong for me and it's Psalms 63:8, and it says: with passion, I pursue and cling to you because I feel your grip on my life. I keep my soul close to your heart. In Psalm 119:37 it says: help me turn my eyes from illusions so that I pursue only that which is true, drench my soul with life as I walk in your paths. That's surrendered to the truth of God's word, that surrender to the truth of God's heart, that surrender to the truth of the word being spoken from that, that proving or that yieldedness to the truth of what God is saying gives you the ability to walk in his strength. And I believe from that we'll be able to operate in the inheritance that God said is ours, the ecclesia, to actually function in, because when we come into the inheritance, we come into the greater place of the image of what God is releasing in us to where we become to be a reflection of all that he is because we become one, as Jesus said, "father, make them one as we are one", we can function fully into the truth of what God wants to do. And the last thing I'll say is this. When it comes into the surrender, I was thinking it this way. In Acts chapter four, verse 29-31 it talks about, my Lord, look at their threats and grant your servants that with all boldness we may speak your word by stretching forth your hand to heal with signs, wonders and miracles through the name of your holy servant Jesus. And it says, "and when they prayed the place that they were assembled together was shaken and they all were filled with the Holy Spirit and they spoke the word of God with boldness. I believe that that was such a yieldedness, such as surrender to the plan and the purpose and the agenda of the Kingdom of God. They surrendered their life. With just a fullness. They said, "Father, whatever you want will do". And from that, they began to experience another divine encounter, which I felt the Lord speak to me one day and said, I'm releasing strategies for kingdom advancement. So the surrender gives us the ability to walk in the strategies of heaven to fulfill the purpose and to be able to accomplish the plan because

we become one with him. And we're not worried about ourselves. We're not worried about what what's going on around us. We're focusing on the agenda of heaven and seeing the plans and the principles of his kingdom begin to be made known by a yieldedness, by yield of heart, without any reservation: Father, whatever you want, I will do. And from that place, I believe we'll pursue with a purpose and begin to start seeing the significance of kingdom come upon our life. This powerful word, Clay, and that's the thought that I have coming from the word that was spoken. Thank you for the opportunity.

And I want to say to the other participants on the call, thank you for being on. Thank you for adding your power of agreement. One put a thousand to flight, two puts ten thousand. We are seeing, I believe, the prayers on this call as well as many other the calls across the nation. But on this call, we saw the Senate, the Republicans stand together today and stop something that could be very, very detrimental to our nation. Well, we're honored to have Dutch Sheets on with us. Dutch, I want to say before you speak that this word is strong, but if you would have heard the word that Dutch preached afterwards on that Saturday night, it really amplified and magnified the word of the Lord that came and brought some understanding to it. But just to summarize some things, I think it's incredibly, to use of the word in the word, it's incredibly comforting to know that his comfort process conforms us, and I'm struck by the fact that he's not just trying to utilize our prayers and decrees and lives to bring forth his will and purposes with his sovereign and incredible wisdom. He is also conforming us in the process. And, you know, I've always loved the verses that Brother Jim brought forth, that we're comforted with the comfort with which we've been comforted. We encourage others, I think he brought that out beautifully. But it strikes me as very significant that he would use the same word to describe what we do, the parakle...parakletos..the different forms of that word. He would use the same word to describe what we do as what Holy Spirit does. The very name, one of the names of Holy Spirit. Holy Spirit wants to release who he is through us. But the only way he can do that is allow us to, of course, be conformed, or we have to allow him to conform us to who he is. When that happens, we can do more than experience victory. We can release him. And, you know, I've been just really struck today with the fact that he wants to do more than change this nation through us. He wants to change us as we change this nation. And if we allow him to do that, I think the point...one of the points he's making is if we allow him to do that, the change will be far greater than just a surface thing. He's trying to go very deep. He's trying to raise up an Ekklesia right now that can do more than experience victory. We can manifest him. And I think also that's what the process is from the sheep to the lion. You know, nothing can change the fact that we are his and he is our shepherd and he will shepherd us as his sheep. But he wants us to do more than that. He wants us to look like him. He wants us to not only be sheep who follow him, he wants to be lions that manifest him. And so, you know, that whole thing was comforting to me and and just brought out the

fact that he's doing more than using us. He's transforming us. And that's been said. But I feel like I needed to say it again. And then when that's finished, we do, we do operate from that for which we've warred. So, you know, I think I just want to decree Clay into this group and into what God is doing in the nation right now, through his people. He is positioning us right now to be a part of something the Earth has never seen. He's positioning us to manifest a level of who he is that the Earth has never seen. The ticks are pulled out of you and hope deferred is broken off of you and the wilderness mindset is broken off of you. And you will think like the King. You will think from a position of victory. You will think from a position of transformation. You will think from a position of intended purpose and intended destiny, not what Satan did, not where we are now, but from where he is taking us, because that is our destiny. So I speak over the church, life, healing, hope. Faith, strength, endurance, conformity to his will, his purpose, I speak over to you that you are not just sheep, you are lions. You will roar, you will conquer, you will manifest the lion of Judah, you will release the roar. This is the season of releasing the roar, and it is a part of the redeeming all season. So we anchor ourselves to your word. We war with your word. We decree your word. We submit to your word. We become one with your word. And we speak this over your people now and we say to the body of Christ, rise up, rise up. To your feet, lions'. Be bold. The wicked flee when no one pursues but the righteous are bold as a lion. I speak boldness. I speak faith and I speak strength, in Jesus name. A man,
